EFP FILM SALES SUPPORT Funds 27 European Films at the Toronto International Film Festival 2018 – EUROPE! Umbrella – Updated Guide to 94 World Sales Companies

The **Toronto International Film Festival** (TIFF, September 6-16) is one of the most important gateways for European films to the North American market. Since 2004, **EFP** (**European Film Promotion**) has been granting **FILM SALES SUPPORT (FSS)** for special promotion and marketing campaigns to European world sales companies to increase the visibility and chances for sales at this mayor festival. With a ratio of more than 60 per cent in terms of sales to countries outside of Europe, the initiative, which is financially backed by the **Creative Europe – Media** Programme of the European Union, has more than proven its merits for the European film industry.

Despite severe budget cuts for 2018 and 2019 and in a joint effort with the industry, FSS managed to back 27 European world sales companies by reserving €83,000 to promote 27 films from 17 different European countries at TIFF's industry centre at the Hyatt.

16 films in the FSS line-up will celebrate their world premiere at TIFF, amongst them the Gala Presentation of the dark sci-fi drama *High Life* by legendary French filmmaker Claire Denis starring Juliette Binoche, Robert Pattison and Lars Eidinger and the Special Presentation of the small-town drama *Tell It to the Bees* by British director Annabel Jankel, featuring Oscar-winner Anna Paquin and Holliday Granger. For the first time in ten years, a film from Slovenia, the feature film debut *Consequences* by Darko Stante has its world premiere in TIFF's Discovery Section. FSS was also granted to four documentaries screening in the—TIFF Docs, section including the world premiere of *Freedom Fields* by British director Naziha Arebi which takes an intimate look at post-revolution Libya through the eyes of an all-women soccer team.

Thanks to SWISS FILMS, two films from Switzerland will receive FSS: *Midnight Runner* by Hannes Weingartner featuring European Shooting Stars Luna Wedler and Max Hubacher and the world premiere of *The Innocent*, a haunting drama by Simon Jaquemet in the Platform section of the festival.

This year's **EUROPE! Umbrella** hosts 14 EFP member organisations, representatives of Eurimages and, for the first time, three European world sales companies. All in all, 25 European countries are present at the TIFF Industry Centre, including 11 EFP members which operate





individual stands. They jointly support 166 European films and co-productions presented in the various sections of the festival.

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


