AMP Filmworks Puts Cyprus on Film Map

Cypriot production house AMP Filmworks had a big break-through when its feature film Smuggling Hendrix directed by the company's founder Marios Piperides had its world premiere and won the Best International Narrative Feature at the Tribeca Film Festival and was picked up by German sales agent The Match Factory. Now the 14-year-old company is developing a slate of four feature films to keep the momentum going.

As FNE write, producer Janine Teerling and director Petros Charalambous, who is attached to their next film Patchwork, following their presentation at the pitching forum Connection Cottbus, about the slate of films and the situation for filmmakers in Cyprus, Patchwork is likely to be AMP Filmworks' next film to go into production, with 60% of the budget already in place.

With the introduction of a 35% cash rebate programme in October 2018, Cyprus is poised to join its EU neighbours on the film production scene. Applications for the rebate programme are now open to both film and TV projects with a minimum spend of 200,000 EUR and a cap of 1.5 m EUR. The rebate will apply to funds spent in Cyprus and it expected to increase.

With the introduction of a 35% cash rebate programme in October 2018, Cyprus is poised to join its EU neighbours on the film production scene. Applications for the rebate programme are now open to both film and TV projects with a minimum spend of 200,000 EUR and a cap of 1.5 m EUR. The rebate will apply to funds spent in Cyprus and is expected to increase domestic production, minority coproductions and production services on the island.

Funding is coming from the Cyprus Ministry of Education and Culture for production, and development funding from the SEE Cinema Network. The film has a Greek coproducer attached, Boo Productions, and is awaiting funding results from the Greek fund and ERT. The producers have interest from other producers from different countries from the Balkans and Western Europe, and it is likely to be a four countries' coproduction.

The film's story, set in a patriarchal society, is the drama of a young mother troubled by her ambiguous feelings about motherhood and the broken relationship with her own mother. Patchwork, which will be Charalambous's second feature, is scheduled to go into production in the second half of 2019 or early 2020.

Cypriot writer/director Kyros Papavassiliou is working on the final draft of his second feature film, Embryo, Larva, Pupa, Imago, which is scheduled to shoot in the spring of 2020. The Cypriot/Greek coproduction with a budget of 850,000 EUR is looking for a third coproducer for this surreal drama, a love story of a couple who live in a world where time is arbitrary. Kyros presented his short film in the Official Competition of the Cannes Festival in 2007, while his first film premiered in Rotterdam in 2016.

Writer/director Adonis Florides is working on his third feature film, Africa Star. The film will be a Cypriot production that tells the story of a family stigmatised by crime in the past. The company is also producing Spyros Charalambous's first feature film Common Good. His latest short film premiered in Clermont Ferrand.

The company has other projects in scriptwriting stages, including Marios Piperides's second feature film.

Moromete Family: On the Edge of Time becomes the most popular Romanian film in 16 years

Just three weeks after its domestic release, Stere Gulea's Moromete Family: On the Edge of Time has become the most popular Romanian film in the last 16 years, with as many as 154,137 admissions, according to statistics published by the country's most popular movie website, Cinemagia.ro. The Libra Film production was distributed by Transilvania Film, so far earning circa €429,000 (against a €1.5 million budget).

The film's popularity may be explained by the success of the original movie, which many consider to be the best adaptation in Romanian film history. Released in the second half of the 1980s, *The Moromete Family*, based on Marin Preda's novel of the same name, was watched by 2.24 million cinemagoers, according to figures made public by the Romanian Film Center - CNC.

Given the fact that the numbers are now dwindling (only 18,000 admissions during the third weekend on release), it seems that the sequel is unlikely to surpass the popularity of Garcea and the Oltenians, a comedy produced by Media Pro Pictures, which is still the most popular Romanian movie since 1996. Released in 2002, the film was met with overwhelming enthusiasm (despite being panned by critics), reaching a total of circa 290.000 admissions.

The success of Moromete Family: On the Edge of Time was certainly bolstered by the most elaborate promotional campaign ever seen in Romania. The production company and the distributor started their promotion efforts as early as the summer of 2016, when the project received €330,000 from the Romanian National Film Centre. Every significant moment in the production process was accompanied by press events and press releases, all culminating in a long string of early screenings attended by the cast and crew, almost everywhere in Romania − even in towns that don't have a cinema any more.


The new release may be the most popular in 16 years, but it is far from being the most profitable recent Romanian production: Paul Negoescu's buddy comedy Two Lottery Tickets [+] (2016) earned a comparable amount with a budget of only €30,000 (read the news).



For the first time the festival hosted the industry event Bulgarian Producers by the Sea, as part of the Mannheim Meeting Place (MPP).

Producers by the Sea is supported by the Bulgarian National Film Center and it was organised as part of the Mannheim Meeting Place (MPP), the Mannheim-Heidelberg IFF's annual platform specialised in on-the-job support of start-up producers in international coproduction.

The local Bulgarian Project Feeder Channel for MMP included six projects represented by their producers. The level of the international experts was particularly high. The two day event was moderated by the MMP coordinator Julek Kedzierski.

"This is an extremely important event for the festival and Congress Center in Varna as one of our main missions is to help young people", manager Toshko Gyaurov told FNE.

A total of 110 films were screened including 12 titles in the International Feature Film competition and 10 in the Youth Cinema competition.

The festival opened with Paweł Pawlikowski's Cold War (Opus Film, Apocalypso Film and MK Production) and wrapped with Hirokazu Kore-eda's Golden Palm winner Shoplifters.

The Danish documentary *The Distant Barking of Dogs* has picked up the main award in the international competition at this year's CinéDOC-Tbilisi in Georgia, the first international documentary film festival in the Caucasus.

Directed by Simon Lereng Wilmont, the documentary is set in Eastern Ukraine on the frontline of the war. It follows the life of 10-year-old Oleg over the course of a year, witnessing the gradual erosion of his innocence from the pressure of war. Ol eg lives with his grandmother, Alexandra, in the small village of Hnutove. Having no other place to go, Oleg and Alexandra stay and watch as others leave the village.

The Distant Barking of Dogs had its world premiere at the International Document ary Festival Amsterdam, where it won the 'First Appearance Award'. It has since s creened in the U.S (where it won the Golden Gate Award at the San Fransisco Int ernational Film Festival), Israel, Sweden, Hong Kong and Greece.


