Incentives for local and international productions include a cash rebate and tax credits of up to 35%, tax discounts on investments made on equipment and infrastructure and other incentives. Feature films, television series, documentaries, animation and natural history programmes can all qualify for the incentives.

Speaking at the summit, Michalis P. Michael, the Chairman of Invest Cyprus said, "The island is a unique natural film studio in itself. Apart from the natural beauty aspect, Cyprus also represents an attractive investment for any producer looking for a filming destination that also has the right formula of incentives in place. The Republic of Cyprus has recently introduced an attractive incentives scheme offering



This year the festival of Czech and Slovak cinema in Paris will commemorate the anniversary dates that constitute the history of Czechoslovakia, notably its creation in 1918 and the Prague Spring in

Under the patronage of the Ambassador for the Czech Republic, S. Exc. M. Petr Drulák and the Ambassador for the Slovak Republic, S. Exc. M. Igor Slobodnik, the festival will be held this year at the cinema Christine 21 situated in the 6th arrondissement of Paris. A range of formats and genres will pay homage to the history of Czechoslovakia in the way Czech-In knows how, through film. It is the historical film Masaryk by Julius Sevcik that will open the festival and take a look at the life of Jan Masaryk, a diplomat and minister of foreign affairs as well as the son of Czechoslovakia's first president, Tomáš Garrigue Masaryk. The former can be spotted in the projection of Czech National Film Archive footage which is to be accompanied by the live music of Czech artists Irena and Vojtech Havlovi. This will be a unique occasion to discover the rare material that documents the personalities and events involved in the creation of Czechoslovakia in 1918. One of the extracts even shows Czech legions in France during the First World War.

Czech-In also invites you to discover the unedited 1990 documentary on T. G. Masaryk, TGM the Liberator, directed by the great Vera Chytilové. Also on offer is the Jan Nemec documentary filmed live during the August 1968 invasion of Czechoslovakia during the repression of the Prague Spring, Oratorio for Prague.

The new generation of Czech and Slovak cinema will be represented by Karlovy Vary IFF winner Václav Kadrnka; who will present his film, Little Crusader, in person. There will also be Peter Bebjak's The Line, whose win at the Arras Film Festival among many. Two talented female directors from Slovakia will enrich the programme even further. The first is Tereza Nvotová, whose drama Filthy was voted the best film of 2017 by Czech critics and the second is Iveta Grófová with Little Harbour a film that premiered and was awarded at the Berlinale IFF. The films will be introduced by a range of guests, including several French film professionals, Kristina Aschenbrennerová from the Slovak Film Institute and producer Jiří Konečný.

To conclude the festival, there will be a debate at the Czech Cultural Centre (18 rue Bonaparte, 75006 Paris) between our special guests and their fellow Parisian colleagues. The topic of focus is the heritage of the centenary of Czech and Slovak independence.

BUCHAREST: A draft for a new film law prepared by the Romanian Film Centre (CNC) will introduce the possibility for a film to be funded up to 80% of its budget due to a new category that would enable every Romanian film to be considered a difficult film.

Members of the film community discussed the draft with representatives of the CNC in a debate within the 9th Les Films de Cannes à Bucarest, which takes place in Bucharest from 19 to 28 October 2018 and in seven other Romanian towns until 11 November 2018.

Producers and filmmakers agree with some of the new proposals of the draft, but are cautious about others. For example they think that collecting all the taxes from advertising for the Film Fund would make the film industry more rigid.

FNE at the 9th Les Films de Cannes à Bucarest: Cultural Hubs as Solution to Revive Old Cinemas

BUCHAREST: Old Romanian cinemas recovered by local authorities could be refurbished and transformed into cultural hubs if they become part of a national plan that would apply for European support for digitalisation.

That was the starting point of a panel organised at the 9th Les Films de Cannes a Bucarest. The founder of the festival, director/producer/distributor Cristian Mungiu, plans to bring together representatives of key institutions and to move forward on the creation of an association that would help all Romanian cinemas in need.

Cinemas are a weak spot in Romania. Despite the fact that admissions increased to 13.8 m in 2017 due to multiplexes, the tradition of one-screen cinemas is vanishing. Romania Film, which took over the Communist era network of cinemas, announced recently that it will close 10 cinemas, leaving only three open, in Cluj-Napoca, Sibiu and Piatra Neamt.

BUCHAREST: Four coproductions from CEE countries which premiered in Cannes in 2018 are among the eight titles competing for a distribution award in the new competition Aide à la Distribution launched by Les Films de Cannes à Bucarest. The festival, initiated by Cristian Mungiu with the support of the General Delegate of the Cannes Film Festival, Thierry Frémaux, takes place in Bucharest and also in seven Romanian towns from 19 October to 11 November 2018.

The eight titles do not have Romanian distribution yet, so the 2,500 EUR award consisting of financial support and a promotional package will be given by Asociația Cinemascop (one of the organisers of the festival) to a Romanian distributor, who will decide to distribute one of them. The winner will be voted by the audience.

For the first time the festival will give two distribution awards of 2,500 EUR to the future Romanian distributor of an international film screened in Cannes and also of 5,000 EUR to a Romanian film that







Estonian Film Institute (EFI) was reorganized on the basis of Estonian Film Estonian Foundation in 2013 by the Government of Estonia as a private legal institution.

Institute The objective of Estonian Film Institute is to preserve and develop Estonian national film culture. The foundation is guided by the cultural policy of the Republic of Estonia and the trends in the field of film.



The Malta Film Commission is a government body established by CHAPTER 478 (Act No. 7 of 2005) of the Laws of Malta, consisting of an advisory body for the role of advising the Minister responsible for the film sector on policies

pertaining to the promotion, development and support of the audiovisual and film servicing industry.



Slovenian Film Centre

The goal of the Slovenian Film Centre is to encourage creativity in the film and audiovisual field in the Republic of Slovenia by creating suitable conditions for film, audiovisual and cinematographic activities.

Slovenian Film Centre, a public agency of the Republic of Slovenia, became operational on 19 January 2011 as a successor of the Slovenian Film Fund - a public fund.



Georgian National Film Center (GNFC) sets state policy in the film sector. The Film Center is a legal entity of public law under the Ministry of Culture and Monument Protection tasked with providing state support to national cinematography.



The Slovak Audiovisual Fund is the main public funding institution for the Slovak film industry. The aim of the Fund is to support the whole film value chain development, production, distribution and promotion of audiovisual works, festivals, research, training activities and technological development

(first of all digitisation of cinemas). Finances of the Fund are based on the combination of state budget subsidies and contributions by subjects using audiovisual works.



The Slovak Film Institute, member of FIAF and European Film Promotion, is the sole national institution in the field of cinematography in Slovakia. It consists of the National Film Archive and the National Cinematographic Centre. SFU handles producer rights to Slovak films produced by 1991, and supports the international presentation of both the archive films and current

independent film production.



The Lithuanian Film Centre, established in May, 2012, is a state institution under the Ministry of Culture of the Republic of Lithuania. The Centre operates under the Film Law (amended in 2011).

The aim of the Centre is to participate in designing an effective film and audiovisual sector policy and to foster the sustainability of the Lithuanian film industry.



National Film Centre of Latvia was established on December 23, 1991, as a state institution under the Ministry of Culture. The organisation's main objectives are: to administer the Government's financial support to Latvian films; to prepare legal acts and Governmental documents securing the

functioning of filmmaking in Latvia; to preserve the national audio-visual heritage; to promote Latvian films abroad; to co-operate with the relevant international and national organisations; to register films and videos, as well as issue licences to video distribution companies in Latvia; to form a data-base of Latvian films and filmmakers

Compared to 2017, the number of cinemas increased from 149 to 153 and the number of digitalised screens increased from 189 to 195. Slovakia also has one IMAX cinema, which was opened in 2015.



Several small art house cinemas operate in Bratislava. Kino Lumière, operated by the Slovak Film Institute, opened on the site of the former Charlie's Centrum in September 2011. Mladost, Nostalgia and Film Europe Cinema also add to the diversity of Bratislava's art house landscape, together with Kino Klap, located in the Academy of Performing Arts, Foajé and Kino inak, a screening room hosted by the alternative cultural centre A4 – Space for contemporary culture.

A new programme of support for Slovak films in domestic cinemas was launched in 2016. Every cinema has the right to apply and receive one euro per each ticket sold for a domestic title. In 2016 the AVF




